Headlice

Please note that health regulations require that where a child has head lice, that child should not return to school until appropriate treatment has commenced. The school may request the completion of an 'action taken form', which requires parents/ guardians/carers to nominate if and when the treatment has started.

Parents and carers have the primary responsibility for the detection and treatment of head lice.

Responsibilities include:

- -not sending their children to school with untreated head lice
- -using safe treatment practices which do not place their child's health at risk
- -regularly checking for lice or eggs in the hair of their child and other household members
- -notifying the school if their child is affected and when treatment commenced.

Commencing in Term 2, Lunch orders are being processed through the uEducateUs. Parents will be able to order and pay through the app/website without the need to complete a paper order form. For your first order, you will need to set up a credit card payment but from then on your card will be saved and ready for your next payment.

The students thoroughly enjoyed Zali talking about the challenges she has faced, her heavy training schedule, the importance of eating well and exercise and being resilient!








WHAT'S Been HAPPening?

Students in years 4/5/6 will be participating in a Bike Education (Bike Ed) program as part of our Integrated Studies unit focusing on Outdoor Education.

This program aims to equip students with the skills and knowledge to ride their bikes safely and confidently on our roads.

As part of the program students will participate in practical activities as well as classroom-based activities that aim to build their road sense and develop their riding skills. The program will culminate with a 'Big Ride' around the Timor community in the final week of term.

Required Equipment:

- o A roadworthy bicycle in good working condition (these can be stored at school for the duration of our Bike Program)
- o A properly fitted and approved bicycle helmet.

Expectations:

- o Students are expected to follow the instructions of the Bike Ed instructors and adhere to all safety guidelines.
- o Please ensure your child's bicycle is in a safe and roadworthy condition before the Bike Ed sessions.
- o We encourage you to discuss bike safety with your child and reinforce the skills they learn during the program.

Students require their bike and helmet at school by Thursday 1st May.

As the students and staff will be leaving the school grounds to ride on public roads at times, you are required to provide consent for this program by approving it on uEducateUs.


